

# Appendix A

## Organization Glossary

---

<b>ASP – Arizona State Parks</b>	Arizona State Parks manages the state’s natural, cultural and recreational resources, including 30 state parks and natural areas, state trail program, 1,400 camping and RV sites, outdoor-related grants program, historic preservation office, and off-highway vehicle programs.
<b>ASU – Arizona State University, Colleges at Lake Havasu City</b>	The ASU Colleges at Lake Havasu City offer a sampling of the same degree programs available at ASU Phoenix, a comprehensive public university and research center.
<b>ADOT – Arizona Department of Transportation</b>	The Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) is responsible for planning, building, and operating the state’s highway system and bridges efficiently and safely.
<b>BLM – Bureau of Land Management</b>	The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) manages the health, diversity, and productivity of over 245 million acres of Federal public lands. The BLM is also responsible for mineral leasing and operations on both Federal and non-Federal lands.
<b>Casimiro Global Foundation</b>	The Foundation is a nonprofit organization that works to educate and motivate young people to become entrepreneurs, innovators and leaders who create positive change. <a href="http://casimiroglobalfoundation.org">casimiroglobalfoundation.org</a>
<b>CCRSCO – Clean Colorado River Sustainability Coalition</b>	CCRSCO is a coalition of government and tribal agencies located along the Colorado River. The group’s focus is to improve water quality. Specifically the coalition is now focused on the impact of quagga mussels and the increasing challenges of blue-green algae blooms on the Colorado River.
<b>CFEL – Lake Havasu Chamber Foundation for Education &amp; Leadership</b>	The CFEL administers the Lake Havasu Leadership Program and helps businesses in Lake Havasu City access education, training and apprenticeships programs.
<b>CTE – Career Technical Education</b>	Career Technical Education (CTE) offers students of all ages academic and technical skills, knowledge, and training necessary to succeed in future careers and become lifelong learners.
<b>CVB – Lake Havasu City Convention &amp; Visitors Bureau</b>	The Lake Havasu City CVB works to attract and engage visitors through an aggressive regional and national marketing and advertising program. The CVB also works with Lake Havasu City and partner organizations to coordinate special events on the lake and around town.
<b>District – Downtown Lake Havasu Revitalization District</b>	The proposed District will be a self-governing organization dedicated to delivering programs and services that will improve downtown’s economic vitality, image and commercial appeal. Proposed boundaries are south of Mesquite Avenue, north of Swanson Avenue, west of S. Acoma Boulevard, and east of N. Smoketree Avenue.
<b>Downtown Association</b>	The Lake Havasu Downtown Association is working with Hormann & Associates on the formation of a Downtown Revitalization District. The Association markets the Downtown; serves as an advocate for projects that will revitalize Downtown as place for work, visiting, living and entertainment; and promotes awareness of Downtown as an important shopping and entertainment center in Lake Havasu City.

## Havasu 280

Havasu 280 is a major development project for the Lake Havasu City. The City, Arizona State Parks, and Havasu Riviera LLC are jointly master planning this long-term project which is proposed to ultimately include public boat launch(es), dry storage, housing, mixed use commercial, mainland marina, and research and learning facilities.

## Havasu Riviera LLC

Havasu Riviera LLC, the owner and developer of 250 acres adjacent to the Havasu 280 project, is working with Lake Havasu City and Arizona State Parks (ASP) to master plan the Havasu 280 project.

## Hormann & Associates

Hormann & Associates is a consulting firm specializing in forming and managing downtown districts. The firm was retained to form the Downtown Lake Havasu Revitalization District. [www.hormann.net](http://www.hormann.net)

## LHACC – Lake Havasu Area Chamber of Commerce

The Lake Havasu Area Chamber of Commerce (LHACC) provides connection and networking opportunities, advocates for business friendly legislation, recommends candidates for public elected office, hosts special events, and promotes the community.

## Lake Havasu City

The City operates under a council-manager form of government. The Mayor and six Council members are elected to staggered four-year terms. The City Council sets policy and direction, and appoints the city manager. The city manager is tasked with the responsibility of carrying out council policies and administering the day-to-day operations.

## LHHA – Lake Havasu Hospitality Association

LHHA is a membership organization that advocates and educates for the hospitality trade in Lake Havasu City. LHHA tracks legislation and serves as the voice of the local hospitality industry to the legislature. LHHA is expanding its role in hospitality training by joining with Mohave Community College, WAVE/JTED and Workforce Development to create career pathways in the hospitality industry.

## LHMA – Lake Havasu Marine Association

The Lake Havasu Marine Association works to provide a safe and clean lake and river environment with the amenities and services that enhance the boating experience, e.g. installing and maintaining buoys on the lake, monthly clean up, safe boating education.

## LHUSD – Lake Havasu Unified School District #1

The Lake Havasu Unified School District consists of eight schools (six elementary, one middle, and one high school), over 5500 students and 650 staff members. The District's mission is to nurture students to reach their full potential. To that end, the District has committed their engagement with the CFEL, Chamber Foundation for Education and Leadership.

<b>MCC – Mohave Community College</b>	MCC is a comprehensive community college in Lake Havasu City. The College has a student population of 13,000 each year and programs to meet the workforce needs of business and industry. Along with the Partnership for Economic Development, the Lake Havasu Hospitality Association, and Workforce Development, the College will offer a certificate program and career pathway for hospitality careers.
<b>MCCF – Mohave Community College Foundation</b>	The Mohave Community College Foundation promotes the growth and development of Mohave Community College and its students, faculty, staff and programs by receiving, investing and administering private support.
<b>MCEDD – Mohave County Economic Development Department</b>	Mohave County Economic Development Department (MCEDD) is the lead agency for Mohave County economic development. MCEDD provides programs and services for business start-up, expansion and attraction. MCEDD has committed to work closely with Lake Havasu City and the Partnership for Economic Development to create an industry specific prospecting package and virtual building program.
<b>MCWA – Mohave County Water Authority</b>	The MCWA is comprised of representatives of the governing boards of Lake Havasu City, Bullhead City, City of Kingman, Mohave Valley Irrigation & Drainage District, Golden Shores Water Conservation District, and the Mohave Water Conservation District. The Authority is dedicated to making sure its members have an adequate water supply for the future.
<b>Mohave County Workforce Development Division</b>	Mohave County Workforce Development Division operates the One-Stop Career Center in Lake Havasu City. The One Stop provides employment and training services to job seekers, and recruitment, hiring and training assistance to employers. Workforce Development has partnered with PED, the LHHA, and MCC to offer a pathway for hospitality careers.
<b>NAU – Northern Arizona University</b>	Northern Arizona University is a public university offering undergraduate, graduate, and professional degrees of high quality and societal value.
<b>PED – Partnership for Economic Development</b>	The Partnership for Economic Development is a nonprofit organization dedicated to providing the tools and services to grow the Lake Havasu City economy. The PED is the lead organization for implementing the economic development plan.
<b>R/UDAT</b>	Regional/Urban Design Assistance Team is a service of the American Institute of Architects. Teams of interdisciplinary professionals help communities respond to a variety of economic issues. A 2007 R/UDAT report has continued to serve as a resource for many of Lake Havasu City’s ongoing place development and revitalization efforts.
<b>SBDC – Small Business Development Center</b>	MCC SBDC offers training programs, access to resources and one-on-one counseling services throughout Mohave County including Kingman, Lake Havasu City, Bullhead City and Mohave Valley.

**Site Six**

Site Six is a 20,000 square foot building that was the original McCulloch commercial building located on the Island. Built in 1960, the building has been used for many years by Lake Havasu City staff for storage. The City's vision for this building is ground floor retail space for boating-related goods and services and community meeting space on the second floor.

**SNWA – Southern Nevada Water Authority**

The Southern Nevada Water Authority (SNWA) is a cooperative, not-for-profit agency formed in 1991 to address Southern Nevada's unique water needs on a regional basis. SNWA officials are charged with managing the region's water resources and providing for Las Vegas Valley residents' and businesses' present and future water needs. CCRSCo water data is stored with the SNWA.

**STEM**

Acronym used for Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math education. STEM is broadly defined and used to reference the education and skills needed for tomorrow's jobs.

**Visitor Days**

Visitor Days is a term used in the tourism industry to measure the amount of visitor activity. A visitor day, unlike the total number of visitors to a community, is a calculation of the number of visitors and the length of their stay. For example: 1 person staying for 1 day equates to 1 visitor-day; 1 person staying for 7 days equates to 7 visitor-days; and 4 people staying for 7 days equates to 28 visitor-days.

**WAPA – Western Area Power Administration**

WAPA markets and delivers clean, renewable, reliable, cost-based federal hydroelectric power from multi-use water projects to a 15-state region of central and western United States. Lake Havasu City may request an easement for water reclamation line.

**WAVE JTED – Western Arizona Vocational Education Joint Technical Education District**

WAVE JTED is a joint education district with five partner high schools in two counties. JTED provides high quality vocational and technical education that is needed in the public school system to keep students in school and better prepare them for the workforce. WAVE/JTED is partnering with LHHA, MCC and Workforce Development to create career pathways in the hospitality industry.
